

The Rotary Foundation Giving—Every Rotarian Every Year

Thank you Rotarians who have already made your gift to support our clubs \$7,000 goal for the 2017 – 2018 Rotary International Projects. These gifts fund our commitment to support the Every Rotarian Every Year contribution of \$100 per member per year. This is sent to Rotary International to help support Rotary work around the world. Many of these projects we support are reported in the Rotarian Magazine and @ Rotary .org.

Dearborn Rotary's Giving status toward our 2017-2018 EREY goal of \$7,000 is of the 58 members we have, 50% (29ea.) have given. Eighteen are sustaining Members (contributed \$100 or more in a year). The YTD giving total is \$4,300 which is 61% of our \$7,000 commitment. The following have met the Every Rotarian Every Year commitment.

Meeting Notes

The meeting was called to order by President Bob Gleichauf with the singing of the National Anthem. Kathy Gapa gave the invocation. Guests today were Rececca Dennis from The Henry Ford and Brian Yopp from MotorCities National Heritage. They were introduced by Martha Hnatiuk.

Announcements:

Roger reminded members that the President's Party is June 28 at 6 PM at Park Place. Please let Roger know if you are attending if you haven't already done so. We all owe outgoing President Bob a thank you for his service as President this past Rotary year as well as giving a warm welcome to incoming President Glenn who takes the reins starting July 1. **This replaces the noon meeting!**

Roger reminded members about the August 6 Golf Outing. Sponsors, golfers, and workers are needed to make this event a success.

President Bob shared a letter from members thanking Rotarian Bob Young for his tireless support of the club. Bob thanked all Rotarians who were able to attend his 90th birthday celebration.

Darlene asked President Bob to draw his last 50/50 ticket as club president. Kathy Gapa was the winner of \$12.00.

Happy Bucks:

Merritt shared that former Rotarian Wally Smith and his wife, Jean, celebrated their 70th wedding anniversary. They are currently residing at Oakwood/Beaumont Commons.

Jim Thorpe commented on the success of Taste of Dearborn on Wednesday evening as well as his gratitude that the weather cooperated.

Roger gave \$5.00 on behalf of Spectrum in celebration of Bob's return to their company as a full time employee now that his term as President ends.

Today's program follows the long standing club tradition of the outgoing President using his/her last meeting in that role to reflect on the year. Bob began his remarks by indicating that the time for comments about his second term as President (the first being 2006-07) was the need for a do over so he could "get it right" the second time has ended.

Bob began by stating that the Rotary theme for 2006-07 was *Leading the Way*. For the current Rotary Year, the theme is *Making a Difference*. Therefore, Bob felt his comments reflect a combination of those two: *Leading the Way to Making a Difference*.

Bob said that, in looking at the list of Past Presidents listed in the club directory, he knew about half of them and is honored to be in the company of such great leaders. He feels that his family and faith hold his highest priority and that being a Rotarian is also high on that list. He thanked all members of the board that served with him for their extraordinary efforts.

Bob continued reviewing club accomplishments. While the club has become smaller since the time when Bob was a new member, the impact is greater.

The club was successful in rectifying the deficit in the budget. Dues were increased and Happy Bucks implemented. Note this was accomplished without eliminating desserts at the weekly meeting (more on this later!)

There are now 4 active Interact Clubs at Fordson, Edsel Ford, Dearborn, and Divine Child. There were not any when Bob joined.

In 2018 the Rotary Foundation awarded \$50,000 in scholarships to local students.

Rotary International President for 2017-18 suggested as one of his goals that a tree be planted for every Rotarian worldwide. President Bob took this call to heart. With his leadership the club has planted (or will be planting) 66 trees in 3 locations. Thirty-one trees were planted on the campus of Salina Elementary and Middle School in Dearborn in April. Eighteen trees will be planted soon around the Firestone Farm at Greenfield soon. A check for \$10,000 was presented to guest Rebecca Dennis to fund this project. MotorCity Heritage Park, represented by Executive Director Brian Yopp, also received a \$10,000 check and trees will be added to that site later this year.

The Foundation contributed \$118,000 this current Rotary year, exceeding the goal from the last visioning exercise.

Bob set a goal of \$7,000.00 (based on membership) as the club pledge to the Rotary International Foundation. Merritt reported that the contributions from club members reached very close to \$12,000.00!

Rotarian Kathy Kahlil lead a project to assist at-risk students in the 3 Dearborn High Schools. *My Potential* was given \$1,700.00 from the Foundation to launch this initiative. Kathy provided certificates to all Rotarians who contributed to the success of this program: Jim Thorpe, Coleen Neiman, Al Martin, Bob Ziolkowski, Rick Goward, Martha Hnatiuk, Darlene Schoolmaster, Bob Gleichauf, George Darany, Dave Anderson, Travis Furlow, Celia Nasser, Adel Mozip, Regan Ford, Shannon Peterson.

Bob concluded that he feels these demonstrate the big impact a no longer "big" club can have in the local community and beyond. He further offered a special recognition to board member David Anderson, who served as Club Service Director and program chair. He provided outstanding programs as well as being involved in so many club projects and events, usually working quietly behind the scenes.

A final comment was added by Roger Miller in reference to the "no desserts" as a cost saving measure during John Snyder's term as club President. Roger said that at the President's Party honoring John there was a dessert bar, with a sign indicating to John that these were his "Just Desserts!"

The meeting adjourned with the membership reciting the 4 Way Test.
