Past Rotary International President Hugh M. Archer died Friday July 15, 2005 following a lengthy illness. On behalf of all District 6400 Rotarians and the Family of Rotary, we extend our profound condolences to his family and friends.

He will always have a special place in our memories as one of our own District 6400 Rotarians who went on to be a great leader of Rotary International and who enjoyed Rotary to the fullest.

Hugh served as President of Rotary in 1989-1990 and also served as its General Secretary. A Rotarian since 1951, he was a member and past president of the Rotary Club of Dearborn, Michigan. Hugh served Rotary International as a District Governor of D-640 in 1969-1970 and was a Director in 1975-1977.

Hugh was chairman of *Spiratex Company*, a plastics extrusion company. He was chairman or director of several financial firms. Hugh was a registered professional engineer who received his bachelor's degree in electrical engineering from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. In his community, Hugh was active with the *YMCA*, *Boy Scouts of America* and the *Dearborn Schools*. He also served as a Director of *Henry Ford Hospital*.

Hugh Archer was a husband and father, an inventor, businessman, executive, scientist, ham radio operator, engineer, sportsman, attorney, researcher, community leader, Rotarian, banker, humanitarian, inspirational leader. Hugh is survived by his wife of 65 years, Mary Jane, three daughters, June, Ruth and Lucy, and Mary Jane's sister, June Reed.

AWARD

The Hugh M. Archer Memorial Annual Scholarship Award will be in the form of a check for \$ 3,000.00 for the student's college freshman year at an accredited college or university.

CRITERIA

1. The student selected by the Dearborn Rotary Club Selection Committee will best exemplify the Rotary 4-Way Test:
 1. **Is it the TRUTH?**
 2. **Is it FAIR to all concerned?**
 3. **Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?**
 4. **Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?**
2. The scholarship recipient shall be a high school senior attending a public or private high school within the Dearborn School District Boundaries.
3. Selection will be based on academic achievement (Class standing, GPA, SAT, ACT, and Advanced Placement Courses).
4. The selection committee will look at leadership in class and extra-curricular activities.
5. Community service at school and throughout the community.
6. Honors and Awards.

PROCESS

1. Applicant will pull application off the Dearborn Rotary website, prepare the application, and mail the application to (applications will not be returned):

2. Application will be judged by a panel of three Dearborn Rotarians who will be appointed jointly be the Presidents of the Dearborn Rotary Club and Dearborn Rotary Foundation.
3. The winner will be notified by mail and e-mail; other applicants will not be notified.
4. The award will be mailed directly to the college or university where the student will register; the winner will provide the appropriate mailing instructions.
5. The winner will be invited to attend a Club meeting to be recognized.

Applications must be postmarked on or before December 31st. Applications will NOT be returned.
